Driveway robbery

We unfortunately had a driveway robbery in Westmeath road on Tuesday afternoon. Our member was arriving home and drove into the garage. Two black male suspects, both medium height and plump, wearing 'floppy' hats, entered the garage while the door was closing. One was armed. They stole 2 cell phones and a handbag, however did not take the vehicle. Fortunately no one was harmed.

We urge you to be vigilant while entering and exiting your driveway. Be aware of vehicles driving behind you and of people on the pavement or street near your driveway. Remember the vehicle escort home service is available and unlimited. You have the

Police Precinct crime

Crime in our police precinct (Craighall, Craighall Park, Dunkeld West, Emmarentia, Roosevelt Park, Greenside, Hurlingham, Parkhurst, Parktown, Parkmore, Parktown North, Parktown West and Parkview) continues to escalate and there is a noticeable increase in violent crimes. Armed robberies, rape. attempted murder, robberies with a firearm, common robberies and house and business burglaries constituted 63% of the reported crime for this past week. Vehicle related crime (theft of motor vehicles and theft out of motor vehicles) constituted 37% of the reported crimes this past week. The total number of reported

The total number of reported incidents in the precinct last week is the highest that I have seen recorded in the past 3 years.

Community assistance

During the month of September our vehicles performed the following community assistance functions:

- Investigated 3 reports of suspicious persons and 6 reports of suspicious vehicles.
- Assisted a person who collapsed at the corner of Kerry and Kildare roads. ER24 provided the escort to

hospital.

- Called in the Paramedic service for a member who was experiencing breathing and chest problems. ER24 provided the escort to hospital.
- Escorted a drunken resident to his home in Kildare Rd.
- * Removed a drunken male from the corner of Roscommon and Kildare roads and escorted him out of the area.
- ❖ Investigated 4 reports of dogs barking continuously in Kerry Rd and Donegal Ave.
- Contacted a resident who had left their gate open.
- * Reported a fallen tree in Kerry road to JHB emergency.
- Monitored 11 building sites.
- Performed a faulty street light audit.

Our vehicles also:

- Responded to 2446 alarm activations in September.
- Patrolled a distance of 19 981km in September.

SUSPICIOUS "METER READER"

This report came in from one of our members:

On Tuesday this week at about 8:30am the 'electricity meter reader' buzzed. I opened my gate to a young African women (aged approx 17 – 24 years), slim, medium height, wearing a neon-green car-guard type waste-coat. She seemed to be carrying a pen and paper, she did not know where the meter was (and needed to ask the gardener), she appeared to 'read' the meter and left without incident. In retrospect I became suspicious and checked with my maid. She indicated that the meter reader had already come on Monday (the day before), that he usually wore a name / identity badge, and that he always held an electronic credit card type device to enter the readings...

We encourage you to call 24/7 to assist if someone unexpected and/or suspicious rings your doorbell.
