The bad news

Last month one of your neighbours was held up at gunpoint in her driveway after being followed home from Dunkeld shopping centre. Another neighbour was stabbed with a knife after someone broke into his home office.

On average there are three or four incidents like this every month. And there is only one SAPS vehicle on Patrol covering Parkview and eight other suburbs at any one time.

Unless we all act now, sooner or later, this is going to affect you, your family, or your neighbour.

The good news

We can act together as neighbours to reduce crime. We need to increase visible patrolling of our streets to deter crime. We need to start being better neighbours to protect our street and community. We need to pool our resources to do it. If we do this, we can reduce serious crimes by up to 80%.

Safe Parkview

Safe Parkview is an initiative of the Parkview Residents Association. Over fifty residents have been working together to reduce crime. We now have streetleaders organising their neighbours in more than half the suburb.

We have consulted the Police, the Community Policing Forum and security experts. We have created a plan that will put 3 patrol vehicles on our streets every hour of every day, 365 days a year

What will it Cost?

R630 per month per household. This includes fast armed response connected to your alarm if you request at no extra cost.

What will I get?

- 24 hour patrolling of the suburb
- 24 hour contact centre with immediate response by dedicated armed trained officers to any incident or suspicious activity
- Optional connection of your home alarm to the armed response service
- Onive home on call 24 hours a day
- Paramedics emergency response
- SMS alerts
- Full time Parkview security manager
- Regular updates on crime statistics and crime incidents
- Independent home security advice
- Membership of the Parkview Residents Association

And if you are unlucky enough to have a crime incident you will get a home visit, follow-up with police, assistance with ensuring police reports are completed and followed up on, and trauma counselling if you wish.

Streeleader's meeting report back

At the street leaders' meeting on Tuesday 11 November 2008, it became very clear that a 'safe parkview' means more than just employing the same security service provider. It requires the residents to start interacting as a real community.

It will be wonderful to reclaim our public space, to be and feel safer and to know that the whole community is committed to making our suburb safer.

But dare we take it further? In committing ourselves to operate as a community respectful of each other's rights and with an expectation that no laws are broken, is it possible to suggest that it could also imply - not double parking in Tyrone Ave while you run into the Spar, or maybe not parking on a yellow line (or diagonally) while you return your DVD or even not talking on your cell phone while you drive? Would it also include not planting over the whole of your front verge so it is clear for pedestrians and prams - nor cutting down tress on the pavement? And what about not starting to build or alter your property before receiving approval from Council or if applicable, approval from Gauteng's heritage authority? And even complying with the zoning conditions of your property?

We all need to do our bit to reclaim our public space.

Parkview Precinct Plan update

Questionnaires were sent out with the last newsletter as well as delivered to all traders. Now is your chance to have your say on how you see Parkview should develop in the future. The Precinct Plan guides the Council when they respond to rezoning applications – so our contribution will prevent the suburb developing in an ad hoc fashion. The questionnaire is posted on our website www.parkview.org.za - please submit before 30 November 2008.

Current town planning / heritage applications and hearings

The PRA has responded to many rezoning applications in 2008 as well as a number of heritage matters. Some of them include -

34 Dundalk Ave

 Hearing on Tuesday 25th November
 Application to rezone a residential property to a guesthouse with 8 double bedrooms to be built on the property.

63 Dundalk Ave

– Hearing on Thursday 27th November Application to rezone a residential property to Business 4 to allow for a place of instruction, wellness centre, medical suites and offices (this would also allow restaurants, banks and building societies). Identical application submitted for 65 Dundalk Ave.

52 Galway Road (cnr Wicklow)

Owner is advertising their intention to apply to rezone to allow an 8 bedroom guesthouse. Extensive building alterations have started before rezoning approval has been granted. Building inspector has put a stop order on the property. Residents have until 19 November to object to this rezoning application. No heritage approval has been received for this alteration.

22 Dundalk Ave – Approval granted for 9 dwelling units with conditions

The owner was not granted the extension coverage and floor area ratio he applied for. The blanket removal of his restrictive conditions of title was not approved.

34 Lurgan Road – Building in contravention of approval from PHRA-G

After having a stop order from the Provincial Heritage Resources Authority – Gauteng (PHRA-G) served on a double storey alteration, the owner submitted an application for a single storey and received approval from PHRAG. Owner is currently building another storey in contravention of the PHRAG approval and has had another stop order served on him.
